
A change of the number of the job-hopping part-timers according to the age-grade

(Note)

² For data after FY 2002, job-hopping part-timers are defined as 15-34 year old whom are alumnus (and in case of women, also unmarried) and ① Job title should be "a part-time job" ② Who hopes to get/find "a part-time job". ③ For among day labor force, defines the person of "others" who neither attend school nor the operate the unofficial decision of "a part-time job and the housework
